VOTING TIPS TO REMEMBER

IF MAILING IN YOUR BALLOT:

- Request your ballot before October 24th deadline.
- Make your selections in black ink, only one per question.
- Make sure your ballot signature matches your ID signature.
- Return your ballot via USPS. It must be received by Supervisor of Elections before Election Day. You may also drop it off at any Early Voting location via secure drop box, or in person at the BSOE office in Lauderhill.
- You can track your ballot online to make sure it was received.
- Do not give your ballot to anyone else outside of your household to turn in for you.

IF YOU ARE VOTING IN PERSON:

- Take advantage of Early Voting to avoid waiting in line.
- Vote at any polling location during Early Voting, but you must go to the precinct on your voters card if you wait until Election Day.
- You must present valid and current ID with signature & photo.
- Review your ballot and report any errors to the BSOE staff.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Amendment 1: Partisan Election of Members of District School Board

Changes school board elections from nonpartisan to partisan beginning in the November 2026 general election and for primary elections nominating party candidates for the 2026 election

Amendment 2: Right to Hunt and Fish

Preserving the right to fish and hunt in the state constitution.

Amendment 3: Adult Personal Use of Marijuana

Allow adults 21 and older to possess or use recreational marijuana

Amendment 4: Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion

Provides for a state constitutional right to abortion before fetal viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

Amendment 5: Annual Adjustments to the Value of Certain Homestead Exemptions

Requires an annual adjustment for inflation to the value of current or future homestead property tax exemptions.

Amendment 6: Repeal of Public Campaign Financing Requirement

Repeals of the provision in the State Constitution which requires public financing for campaigns of candidates for elective statewide office who agree to campaign spending limits.
